

Quarterly SoonerCare Choice Fast Facts

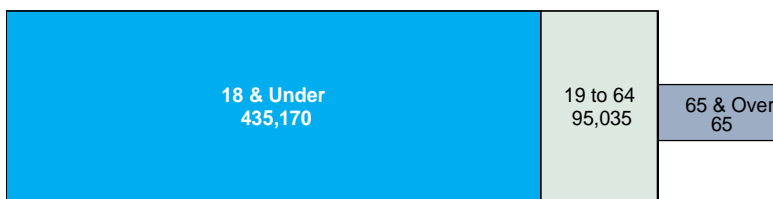

SoonerCare Choice is a Patient-Centered Medical Home program in which each member has a medical home that provides basic health services. Members enrolled in SoonerCare Choice can change their primary care providers as they deem necessary. SoonerCare Choice primary care providers are paid a monthly case management/care coordinator fee. Visit-based services remain comprehensible on a fee-for-service basis.

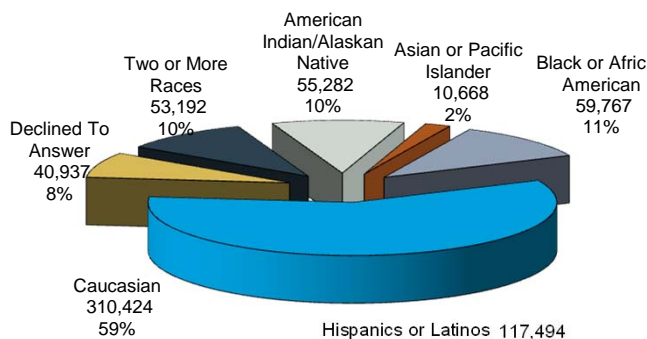

Race Breakdown of SoonerCare Choice



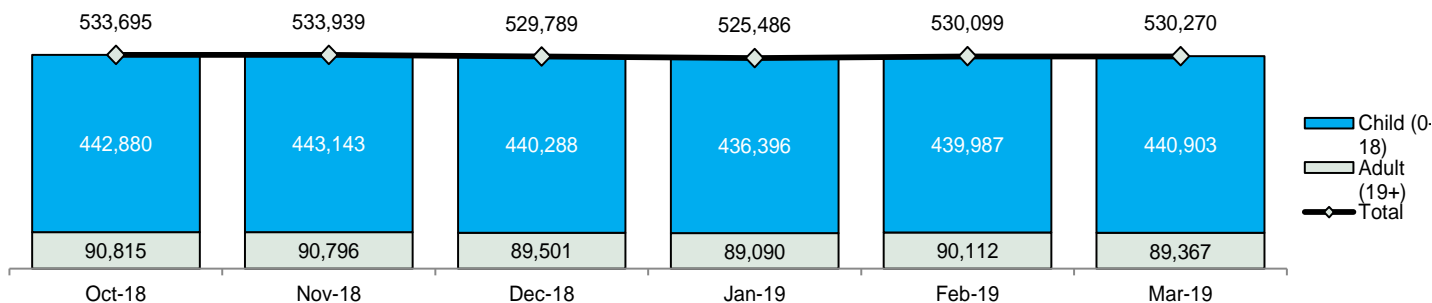
