

OKLAHOMA LIVING CHOICE PROGRAM

What is The Oklahoma Living Choice Program?

This program assists Oklahomans who want to transition out of a nursing home and back into a residence of their own. This program has helped transition more than 800 residents back into their communities and has saved the state nearly \$8.5 million in rebalancing funds.

Services Offered

Depending on an individual's needs, services may include:

- Assistance with finding a new residence.
- Home-delivered meals.
- Transportation.
- Skilled nursing.
- Therapy services.
- Personal care.
- Medication management.
- Transitional funds (one-time allotment of up to \$2,400).

Eligibility

To qualify, individuals must meet the following requirements:

- Be at least 19 years of age.
- Qualify for SoonerCare (Oklahoma's Medicaid program) for at least one day prior to transition.
- Have lived in an institutional setting (nursing home) for at least 60 consecutive days.
- Voluntarily want to transition back into the community.
- Be willing to play an active role in their plan of care.

The Living Choice Program currently serves two populations:

- Members ages 65 and older.
- Members ages 19-64 with a physical disability.
