

SoonerCare and Your

Tribal Community

SoonerCare is public health insurance for qualifying Oklahomans.

Some benefits of being a SoonerCare member include:

- Doctor visits
- Preventive care, such as immunizations, mammograms and colonoscopy
- Prenatal and maternity care
- Hospital stays
- Mental health care
- Needed medications
- Vision and dental care for children
- Transportation to and from doctor visits

Who may be eligible?

- Children and teens up to age 19
- Parents (and possibly other adults)
- Pregnant women
- People with disabilities
- Youth "aging out" of foster care



SoonerCare



As a tribal citizen eligible for SoonerCare:

- You have freedom of choice.
- You may choose from a variety of SoonerCare providers including Indian Health Service, Tribal programs, or the Urban Indian clinics (ITUs).
- However, if you do not choose an ITU clinic as your SoonerCare Primary Care Provider (PCP), please note that only the assigned SoonerCare PCP may complete a specialty referral.
- You are exempted from premiums and copayments.
- Your Indian trust income is not counted to determine eligibility and is protected from Medicaid estate recovery rules.

As a SoonerCare member, you can help bring much needed resources to your tribal community.
