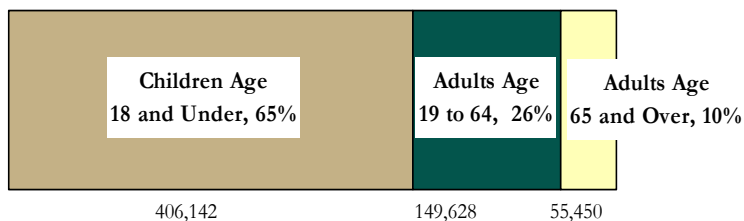

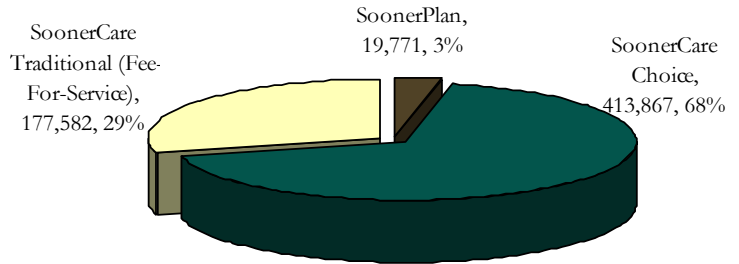

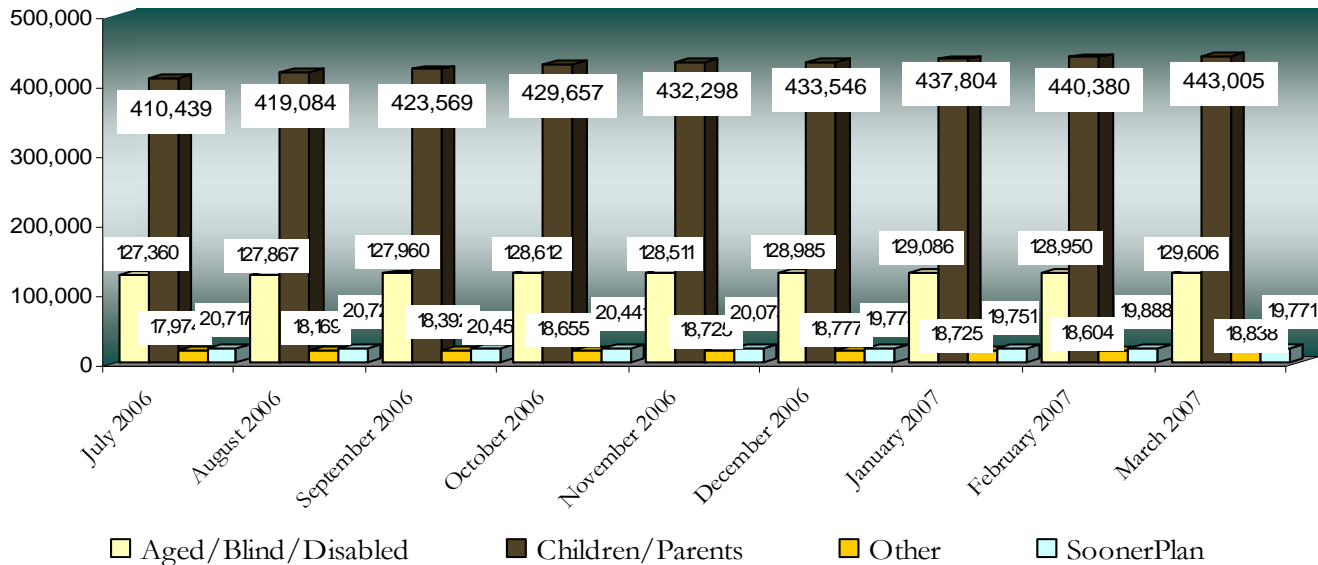

#### SoonerPlan can ease the expense of family planning

National media recently threw the spotlight on college students who are feeling the pinch of the rising cost of birth control prescriptions. However, in Oklahoma, there is help available through the state's family planning program, SoonerPlan.

The Oklahoma Health Care Authority (OHCA) operates SoonerPlan and makes these services available to Oklahomans age 19 and older who meet eligibility requirements. College students who are at least 19 years of age would be considered adults under the program so their eligibility determination would be based on their income.

SoonerPlan is available to both men and women and makes available various family planning services. The program will pay for office visits and physical exams related to family planning, birth control information and supplies, laboratory tests related to family planning services (this includes pap smears and screening for sexually transmitted infections), tubal ligations for women age 21 and older, pregnancy tests and vasectomies for men age 21 and older.

Additional eligibility requirements for the program require that the applicants be residents of Oklahoma and U.S. citizens or qualified aliens. The applicant must not have health insurance coverage for family planning or be eligible for regular Medicaid.

SoonerPlan services are available through any Medicaid provider who offers family planning services. Although additional medical services beyond those listed are not covered under SoonerPlan, the OHCA will provide referral information to members about where they may obtain needed medical services at their own expense.
